

## Directions From Seattle to Visit the USS Turner Joy

From downtown Seattle go to the Coleman Docks where you can walk-on the Washington State (Bremerton) Ferry:



(There's also the Bainbridge Island and the Vashon Island ferries at the same terminal - those are the ones you don't want)

The fare is \$6.50 per passenger to Bremerton - free going back - (East-bound is always free for walk-ons).

The Seattle - Bremerton Ferry Schedule is here:

It takes about an hour. You'll cross Puget Sound - go through Rich Passage - and arrive in Bremerton. Off the starboard beam you'll see the USS TURNER JOY DD-951.

Walk along the boardwalk (about a short city block) from the ferry terminal and you'll be there.



Winter hours: - open only Friday - Saturday - Sunday's 10AM - 4PM.

Spring - Summer - Fall: open 10AM to 5PM 7 days a week.)

If being closed during most of the week during winter hours presents a problem for you, let them know ASAP.
